FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. Who is a first-time student?

A first-time student has no prior postsecondary experience before enrolling at this school. This means that a student who attended another postsecondary school before enrolling at this school is not included in the calculation. The rate also does not include students enrolled part-time, taking individual classes (as compared to enrolling in a full program), or only auditing classes.

2. How are the graduation rates calculated?

The rates are calculated using the Student Right-to-Know formula in order to comply with U.S. Department of Education requirements. The statistics track all first-time, full-time certificate or degree-seeking students who began school during the date range noted above and have graduated within 150% of the normal program length. For example, for a two-year program, the graduation rate would include students who had graduated within three years of beginning the program. The Student Right-to-Know formula: $\text{Column C} \div \text{Column B} \times 100 = \text{Graduation Rate}$.
